Its activities include a quadrennial international Congress, held in various locations in Europe; an annual Colloquium; a website ([www.eurojewishstudies.org](http://www.eurojewishstudies.org)) with online resources including a Directory of Jewish Studies in Europe, and a Funders Database; a Funding Information and Advisory Service (available to EAJS members); and publication of the *European Journal of Jewish Studies*.
